



Postgraduate Physiotherapy Students Insights


We recently had the opportunity to interview some of our postgraduate master's and PhD physiotherapy students to learn more about their journeys, achievements, and experiences.



"I have had the privilege of presenting at international conferences. For example, at ACAPS in France, we presented normative data on the paediatric Emirati population, including anthropometric measurements and physical activity levels. I also participated in FIMS last October in Dubai, where we presented a study on nutrition for athletes as part of Sharjah Women's Sports."

The College of Health Sciences, University of Sharjah, proudly congratulates Ms. Amina Mussa Abdallah Ahmad, Senior Clinical Tutor in the Department of Nursing, for her outstanding achievement at the Nursing and Midwifery Professional Development 2025 conference, where she received the Best Idea Award under the Challenges of E-Learning Effectiveness category. Her award-winning project, titled "Al-Driven Simulated Patient Program: Transforming Mental Health Nursing Education Through Artificial Intelligence" presents a groundbreaking innovation in nursing pedagogy.

The initiative leverages ChatGPT Pro for an Alsimulated psychiatric patient, offering students an immersive and interactive platform to practice clinical communication, mental status assessments, and care planning in a safe and controlled environment.

This Al-based teaching method connects what students learn in theory with actual clinical experience, solving a long-standing problem in mental health nursing education. The program can be adjusted and expanded to include other areas of healthcare, supporting a long-lasting and techdriven way of learning skills based on competency.

Ms. Amina's achievement exemplifies the University of Sharjah's commitment to educational excellence, innovation, and leadership in the integration of artificial intelligence within health sciences education. Her work stands as a model of how emerging technologies can be effectively harnessed to enhance student learning outcomes and advance the future of nursing practice.

Khaled Abass completed his PhD in Medical Sciences (Toxicology) at the University of Oulu, Finland, in 2010. He became a Certified European Registered Toxicologist in 2011 (Geneva, Switzerland) and was appointed Associate Professor in Environmental Toxicology at the University of Helsinki in 2014 (Finland). Since then, he has also served as Finland's designated expert to the Arctic Council's Human Health Assessment Working Group.

He joined the University of Sharjah in August 2022. He is currently an Associate Professor at the College of Health Sciences, University of Sharjah, UAE, and an Adjunct Professor at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Helsinki, Finland. His research focuses on toxicology, environmental health, human health in a changing climate, and epidemiology, with over 70 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters.







Nursing Students Represent the UAE and the University of Sharjah at the 20th Arab Media Forum in Kuwait









Professor Ioannis Savvaidis has been ranked among the top five Best Biology and Biochemistry Scientists in the United Arab Emirates, according to the 4th edition of Research.com's ranking of leading scientists. His research primarily focuses on food science and preservation, with particular emphasis on bacteria and enzymes. One of his most cited works, "Combined effect of oregano essential oil and modified atmosphere packaging on shelf-life extension of fresh chicken breast meat, stored at 4°C", has received over 500 citations—underscoring the impact and quality of his research. In addition to his ongoing contributions, Professor Ioannis is preparing to release his upcoming book, "Marination: A Novel Technology to Improve the Quality and Safety of Foods", scheduled for publication in July 2026.
